- The company's history dates back to 1866 when the Atlantic Petroleum Company was formed in Philadelphia.
- The company acquired Amoco and in 2001 changed its name to BP Amoco P.L.C.
- The name changed to BP P.L.C subsequently.
- BP deals in transportation fuel, energy for light and heat, petrochemical products and retail services for petroleum products.

Environmental impacts of BP

Structural Control of BP.

- It has three main sections or divisions;
- a). Upstream- whose duties are to find, produce and transport gas and oil to the market.
- b).Downstream- in this section crude oil converted into useful products. This division also markets the products world wide.

- c). BP Alternative Energy- this is a division that engages in the investments in low-carbon sources of energy for the future.
- -BP transports its products via the sea, land, through pipeline and via air for non flammable products.
- BP being in a business with many regulations, policies and restrictions it too has to operate under the rules.

Cultural hegemony vs cultural appropriation and adaptation.

- Cultural hegemony is the domination of a society with rich culture by the ruling class. They intend to manipulate the cultural diversity of the society such as the beliefs, perceptions, values and explanations.
- On the other hand cultural appropriation is seen as the adoption of certain elements and characteristics of a one culture by a completely different cultural group.

Definitions conti......

- This gives a description of acculturation or simply assimilation. It can imply a negative outlook from a minority culture by the dominant one.
- Cultural adaptation can be referred to as an evolutionary process under which a person modifies his or her personal customs and habits in order to fit in a particular culture.
- The changes may involve one person or the society at large.

 People engage in cultural appropriation and adaptation in order to coexist with other people of different cultural backgrounds.

Identity questions
